

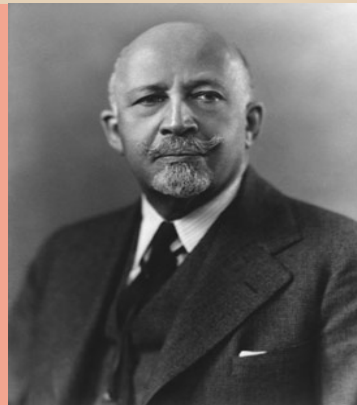

A critical part of the lectures will be the question: Does the era of Obama mean that we have transcended Du Bois' thinking and Du Boisian social science? Has the problem of race as it is being restated in the era of Obama mean that the Du Boisian notions of race, the racialized state, capitalism and socialism are no longer significant?

These lectures are designed to challenge the academy and the wider community to reengage the thinking of W.E.B Du Bois, to reconsider the relationships of politics and power to knowledge and the moral imperative of thinkers to act to change the world for the better.
