- 1. Contact the Ambler campus Admissions/Enrollment Services Office at 267-468-8100 or [ambler@temple.edu](mailto:ambler@temple.edu).**
- 2. Make an advising appointment.** (You do not have to wait until the Open Registration period to see an advisor.) Please bring copies of transcripts from college-level institutions previously attended.
- 3. After you have seen your advisor, take your signed advising form to the Ambler Campus Registration Office in West Hall when Open Registration begins. **Note:** Your Social Security number is required to register.**

# Continuing Student Registration

Advising and General Procedures  
Continuing Student Priority Registration is the period in which all currently enrolled students should register. This registration period is intended to give preference to all continuing students by class level, ensuring that they are able to schedule classes before new students.

To register:

**1. Determine your priority registration start date:**

See the Spring Schedule at: [www.temple.edu/registrar/students/registration/info.asp](http://www.temple.edu/registrar/students/registration/info.asp)

**2. Arrange an advising appointment before your registration start date.** Although your advisor's signature is not required for Self Service Banner (SSB) registration (with exceptions as noted below), you are responsible for fulfilling program guidelines/requirements and course prerequisites, so consulting your advisor is very helpful.

All matriculated and non-degree seeking students (non-matriculated/continuing studies) should make an appointment through **Academic Advising and Career Development, West Hall 109, 267-468-8200, EXCEPT as follows:**

**3. Prepare your roster.** Remember to check for course prerequisites and corequisites.

If you are an undergraduate student, you can obtain your Degree Audit Report (DARS) from TUportal through Self Service Banner. This report is your personal record of academic progress, semester hours completed, and degree requirements still to be met.

When you have reviewed your requirements, you can consult your advisor about course selections. At the same time, you can obtain any forms needed for special course authorizations or approvals. Once you plan your roster, you are ready to register.

**4. Determine which registration method** (SSB or on-campus registration) you must use.

You need advisor **approval** to register by SSB if:

- you are a first semester freshman or first semester transfer with fewer than 30 semester hours OR
- you are a non-degree seeking undergraduate

You are **eligible** for SSB registration if:

- You are a continuing student **and**
- (for undergraduates) your cumulative AND last semester (fall or spring) grade point averages are at least 2.00, **and**
- You have no academic or financial holds on your registration.

If you are **not eligible** for SSB registration, you *must* obtain an advisor's signature and register in person at the Academic Services Office in West Hall.

**5. Register.**

**6. Confirm registration:** Secure the reserved classes by paying the balance or the minimum due on the first bill.

**Failure to confirm classes may result in the cancellation of the registration.**

## Using Alternate Course Work to Satisfy General Education Requirements

Students pursuing undergraduate degrees in the College of Education may be exempted from the GenEd Human Behavior requirement upon completion of collegiate requirements. You must consult an academic advisor for details.

### **Quantitative Literacy (GQ)**

Students considering undergraduate degrees with advanced mathematical or statistical requirements may satisfy the GenEd Quantitative Literacy requirement through alternative coursework. You must consult an academic advisor for details.

### **Science & Technology (GS)**

Students considering undergraduate degrees with scientific, engineering or technical components may satisfy the GenEd Science & Technology requirement through alternative coursework. You must consult an academic advisor for details.

### **World Society (GG)**

An approved summer or semester study abroad program will satisfy the World Society requirement. You must consult an academic advisor for details.

## ProRanger Philadelphia Program - Certificate in National Park Service Management

The ProRanger Philadelphia program is an academic and technical skills training and paid internship program that is cooperatively administered by the National Park Service (NPS) and Temple University. This program is a unique partnership that accepts 12 to 20 students a year into a program that offers: paid summer internships working at national parks throughout the northeast as apprentice rangers; a summer of law enforcement training; special NPS-designed coursework; and, upon graduation, a guaranteed full-time job as a park ranger.



Students from a variety of majors and backgrounds are encouraged to apply. While the primary duties of the ProRanger Philadelphia graduate are protecting people and property, ProRanger Philadelphia trainees do not have to be Criminal Justice majors, and students from any academic major or background may apply. More importantly, a ProRanger Philadelphia trainee should have an aptitude for working with people with diverse backgrounds, have an interest in the outdoors, history and the environment, and have a high standard of ethical behavior.

The 21 credit Certificate in National Park Service Management can be completed as part of an undergraduate degree – courses will apply toward the requirements of most undergraduate majors. For the certificate, in addition to the experiential and internship components that require reflective essays, students will complete other academic courses that explore the mission and functions of the NPS, communications and leadership, and ethics. The certificate program is open to post-baccalaureate students as well as students enrolled in bachelor's degree programs who are part of the ProRanger Philadelphia program.

#### **Environmental Sustainability Certificate (15-16 s.h.)**

The Certificate in Environmental Sustainability provides students with the basic knowledge needed to evaluate environmental problems and to draw ecologically and economically sound connections between environmental needs, policy issues, and current research.

#### **Horticultural Therapy Certificate (14-15 s.h.)**

Horticulture and plants have many therapeutic benefits. Horticultural Therapy uses plants, horticultural activities, and the natural world to improve people's social, educational, psychological, and physical adjustments, thereby improving their body, mind, and spirit. The certificate sequence is accredited by the American Horticultural Therapy Association (AHTA) to meet the horticultural therapy course content required for registration as a Horticultural Therapist. See [www.ahta.org](http://www.ahta.org) for information on additional certification requirements.

#### **Landscape Plants Certificate (14 s.h.)**

This credit certificate provides a brief introduction to all areas of horticulture, plus an intensive learning experience in both woody and herbaceous landscape plants. Learning the names and usage of plants provides a deeper understanding and enriches the experience for anyone interested in gardening and landscaping.

#### **Native Perennial Garden Design Certificate (14 s.h.)**

This credit certificate emphasizes garden design using native perennials. Students learn plant identification, basic drawing and design skills, and how to apply these skills in the native perennial design class. The Landscape Arboretum of Temple University Ambler provides a living laboratory and can offer students excellent hands-on learning experiences.

#### **Community and Regional Planning Minor (18 s.h.)**

Students undertake formal studies about public planning, preparing themselves for contributions as informed citizens, civically engaged professionals, or ultimately as professional planners. The minor provides students with the background and with stronger credentials to apply for graduate level work in planning.
