The Temple University Department of Landscape Architecture & Horticulture receives numerous requests for project assistance to improve the public domain. These activities greatly enhance the academic experience as well as fulfill our mission and desire to serve the public interest. The Department does not undertake private residential or commercial work. Our mission is to improve the environment through application of ecologically based design.

To accomplish these goals, projects requests should do the following:

- Address public land and/or civic needs and issues.
- Be educational and / or research based.

The Department does not have a budget for these projects; so applicants will need, at a minimum, to provide for expenses necessary to conduct the work. We try to fit requests with the appropriate faculty interest, expertise, and teaching efforts. There is generally a minimum of one semester lead time needed to organize and develop such projects.

Please provide us with the information below to better serve your and the Department's needs.

Project description:

- a) Describe activity or need.
- b) Identify and describe geographic location, size of area to be considered, or scope of project.
- c) Identify issues, problems, and community concern that will be addressed by the activity.
- d) Identify educational objectives and audience.
- e) Identify tasks and timelines.

List partnerships and participants.

Identify resources available to support project activity.

Funds to cover travel, materials, expert consultation, adjunct teaching fees and stipends, student funding (internships, tuition assistance), etc.
