

Masters of Occupational Therapy (MOT)

Requirements: Effective Fall 2009

- All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade no lower than a “B”.
- No College Level Examination Program (CLEP) or course equivalency exams will be accepted for requirements.
- On-line courses are subject to additional review.

Prerequisite Courses

1. Two semesters of Anatomy and Physiology (with a lab). Other lab sciences such as Biology (preferably Human Biology), Chemistry, or Physics may be acceptable. Lab science courses must be taken within five years from beginning the MOT program.
2. Two social science courses. Introduction to Psychology and either Intro to Sociology, Cultural Anthropology, or other social science courses.
3. Life-span Human Development
4. Abnormal Psychology or Theories of Personality
5. Statistics (preferably social science or education based)
6. Access to a computer and basic computer literacy is required. This would include a general knowledge of word processing and Internet access.

Other Requirements

1. Bachelors Degree (or US equivalent) or higher in a discipline other than Occupational Therapy from an accredited college or university.
2. Score of at least the 50th percentile on the Miller Analogy Test (MAT) or the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) within 5 years of the date of application.
3. Score of 600 (paper based), 250 (computer based), or 100 (Internet based) on Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).
4. Statement of Professional Goals: One page essay describing reasons for choosing a career in Occupational Therapy.
5. Two letters of recommendation (online or completed recommendation forms)
6. Interview with departmental faculty

GPA: 3.0 or higher in Bachelors degree
