S/he is hired to help you re-think/improve the course and to help students who are currently enrolled succeed.</p> <p>GenEd Peer Teachers receive a \$1,500 stipend for a semester. Actual roles and responsibilities will be negotiated by the instructor and the student; however, the student is expected to work from 10-12 hours a week during the semester, including attendance at all class sessions.</p> <p>GenEd Peer Faculty receive a \$500 stipend for the term and are expected to monitor the Peer Teacher's development and fulfillment of assigned responsibilities throughout the semester.</p>	Faculty Nomination	12/01/09 for Spring 2010 semester
