- All Temple University School of Pharmacy applicants are required to take a calculus course. Applicants who complete a one-semester (4 credit hours) calculus course equivalent to Temple University's Math C075 or Math C077 will satisfy this segment of the Math pre-requisite.
(Applicants who completed Math C055 prior to Fall 2002 can take Statistics C012/H092 to complete this pre-req.)
- Transfer students from Temple University that choose to take English R050 (College Composition) will fulfill two Core Curriculum requirements.
- Physics may be a non-calculus based course.
- Biology and Physics prerequisites may be taken in any sequence.
- Please note that this sheet is only a suggested sequence and students must complete the full core except WI elective courses.
- Students must fulfill all prerequisites and co-requisites before registering for any classes.
