PREPARATION FOR THE STUDY OF PHARMACY

The American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy and the American Council for Pharmaceutical Education have adopted regulations that require all member schools to offer a minimum course of six academic years. **The School of Pharmacy at Temple University** has established a minimum pre-professional requirement of two academic years followed by four years of instruction in the School of Pharmacy. The two-year pre-professional program may be completed at any accredited liberal arts, community or junior college. The courses listed on the reverse side are a suggested pre-pharmacy program for students enrolled at Temple University's College of Science and Technology. **Pre-pharmacy programs in other institutions vary somewhat due to differences in course credits and course content.**

Applicants must apply through PharmCas (**effective June 1, 2007**), electronic applications are required. It is also in the best interest of the student to thoroughly understand the PharmCas application Process. It is the **responsibility of the applicant** to request the forwarding of official transcripts from all colleges previously attended to the Office of Admissions of the School of Pharmacy. A supplemental Application and \$35 fee must be mailed **DIRECTLY** to Temple University School of Pharmacy subsequent to completing PharmCas required materials.
