

Cambodia HIV/AIDS Prevention and English for Life Programs

The new Cambodia HIV/AIDS Prevention English for Life Programs provide direct education, and build the skills of local teachers in **English as a Foreign Language (EFL) and HIV/AIDS Prevention**. English is not part of the Cambodian public school curriculum. However, many residential children's centers, orphanages, private nonprofit schools, and community-based organizations offer English language instruction, recognizing its importance to the future livelihoods of the children and youth in their care. Additionally, young Cambodians often do not receive sufficient attention from HIV/AIDS prevention organizations. GSC volunteers have the opportunity to help close the English knowledge gap, increase teachers' comfort levels in teaching HIV/AIDS prevention, and **keep future generations safe from this disease**.

Thailand HIV/AIDS Prevention, Orphanage, and Health Programs

In Thailand, volunteers have the opportunity to utilize their skills and abilities to teach **HIV/AIDS Education and Prevention** in secondary schools or general English to young Thai children and novice monks, while being immersed in the rich and vibrant Buddhist culture. Volunteer participants in the Orphanage Program provide underprivileged Thai children the **attention and support services** they so desperately need. The Integrated Program allows participants to combine two of these areas into one program. Students studying **pre-med, public health, international development, or related fields can participate in the International Health Program**. This program allows volunteer participants the unique opportunity to experience the day-to-day operations of a Thai hospital or clinic as they **shadow doctors and nurses** on their rounds while also providing community training services. Nine-week Internship Programs are offered for all programs in Thailand for academic credit.

Tanzania HIV/AIDS Prevention, Sustainable Agriculture and Health Programs

Explore Africa through one of our programs in Tanzania, where GSC is a registered NGO and respected leader in the community. Tanzania volunteer participants can choose from programs in **HIV/AIDS Prevention and Sustainable Agriculture and Food Security**. Students with more time to spend can combine both of these areas of service in GSC's Integrated Program. GSC also offers an **International Health Program** in Tanzania designed for pre-med and other students studying health-related subjects. This program includes HIV/AIDS prevention community education and training as well as opportunities to shadow medical staff in local health care facilities. Nine-week Internship Programs are offered for all programs in Tanzania for academic credit. Longer **Community Development Programs are available** and especially suited for those interested in pursuing a career in international development.
