Program Overview

The Adult and Organizational Development program at Temple integrates the theory and practice of adult learning, applied communication, and systems dynamics in developing groups and organizations. It is designed for students who aspire to be conflict management professionals, trainers, team facilitators, and organizational/human resource consultants.

Graduates of the program will be prepared for positions of leadership in diverse public and private organizational settings such as education, community and government, industry, health, business and professional or voluntary organizations or as sole practitioners. The program is designed to enhance capacities for assessing and intervening in organizational, group, and interpersonal processes.

Degree Requirements

You can earn your Ed.M. degree by completing 36 graduate credits, including 12 credits of core courses, 15 credits of AOD electives, 6 credits of non-AOD electives, and a 3-credit capstone course.

Application Deadlines

We are pleased to offer rolling admissions, which means that students may apply to the AOD program at any time during the academic year. However, Ed.M. applications should be completed by **June 1** to begin your program in the *Fall Semester* and by **November 1** for *Spring Semester*.

Admissions Requirements

- Proof of Bachelor's Degree from an accredited institution of higher learning;
- Undergraduate GPA (4.0 scale) of either 2.8 for all undergraduate work, or 3.0 for the last two years in the applicant's major;
- Scores on national tests (GRE or MAT) that are no lower than the 50th percentile, and which have been taken no longer than 5 years prior to application;
- Two copies of an official transcript from every institution of higher learning which the applicant has attended. (Temple University School Code: 002906)
- Three letters of recommendation.
