The Visiting Research Scholar (Postgraduate) is expected to gain laboratory and research experience, to learn to use state-of-the- art techniques, and/or to share unique expertise with the Temple community. VISITING FACULTY	Terminal professional degree	An individual appointed as Visiting Faculty holds an appropriate terminal degree (or equivalent) or is a recognized expert in her/his field. Visiting Faculty typically hold academic appointments at other academic institutions or are employed in business, non-profit organizations, or government agencies and are granted temporary University positions while on leave from current employers. A Visiting Faculty member is expected to engage in the research and/or teaching activities of a department.
