No tuition credit is given for courses taken in Temple's School of Law, Medicine, Dentistry or College of Podiatric Medicine.</p> <p>One-half tuition remission in Temple University undergraduate colleges for either undergraduate or graduate courses. No tuition credit is given for courses taken in Temple's School of Law, Medicine, Dentistry or College of Podiatric Medicine.</p> <p>100% tuition remission for legally dependent children for up to ten (10) semesters to complete a degree in a Temple University undergraduate program. The dependent child must less than 24 years of age when initially enrolled.</p>
