## **Graduate Teaching Fellowship\* Application Guidelines Center for the Humanities at Temple**

**Application deadline for 2012-13 is March 2, 2012**

**C**HAT provides Graduate Teaching Fellows with research support and offers them the opportunity to teach an innovative interdisciplinary humanities course. The fellowship includes a full stipend (identical to that for humanities TAs), one tuition credit, benefits, and \$1000 in research funding. Fellows receive office space at the Center and join the bi-weekly CHAT Fellows Seminar, where they present part of their dissertation for discussion and critique. Fellows also teach a course of wide humanistic concern related to their research or creative interests.

### **Eligibility**

This fellowship is available to Temple Ph.D. students in good standing who have completed all course and exam requirements for the degree and will be elevated to candidacy by the start of the fellowship term (see *Graduate School Policies and Procedures* 02.27.13). Applicants should work closely with the department or program chair or undergraduate director in proposing a course for consideration. Past and current recipients of this fellowship are ineligible for this award.

### **Application**

Your application must communicate the significance of your project to faculty outside your own discipline. Please submit:

- A statement of proposed research (4-5 pages double-spaced) describing the intellectual significance of the project. Provide an overview explaining the basic ideas, problems, or questions examined by the study. Explain how the project will complement, challenge, or expand relevant studies in the field. Include a description of the current state of the work.
- A description of the proposed course including major texts or materials and a rough projected schedule (1-2 pages). A complete syllabus is unnecessary.
- A current C.V.
- One confidential letter of reference by a faculty member familiar with the candidate's research, preferably the dissertation director, sent separately by the recommender.

In addition, please ask the undergraduate director of the department(s) offering the course to write a note agreeing to offer it should your application be successful. Send all materials as email attachments to [chat@temple.edu](mailto:chat@temple.edu).

### **Graduate School Senior Doctoral Fellowship Coordination**

*Eligible candidates may apply simultaneously to be considered for the Graduate School Senior Doctoral Fellowships without further documentation. Only one application is needed. Applicants who wish to be considered for both fellowships should indicate this in the cover letter.*
