Who are EO Ombudspersons and how are they associated with the Office of Multicultural Affairs (OMCA)?

EO Ombudspersons are Temple University administrators who act as liaisons for the Affirmative Action Compliance and Investigation Unit of the Office of Multicultural Affairs.

How are EO Ombudspersons selected?

EO Ombudspersons are generally appointed each year by the provost and vice presidents.

When should I contact an EO Ombudsperson?

- When you need someone to listen.
- If you believe that there is a possible violation of university policy.
- When you need support.

Do I have to go to the EO Ombudsperson from my school/college or department?

No. An EO Ombudsperson will speak to you without regard to school/college/department affiliation or physical location.
