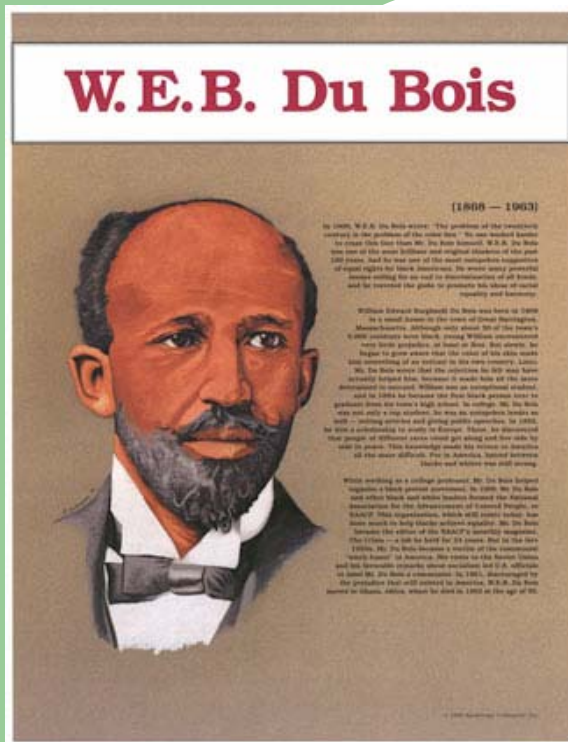


A Conversation on Double Consciousness

Molefi K. Asante is Professor of African American Studies at Temple University. He is the leading scholar of Afrocentricity/Africology and a major scholar in the study of communication. He is author of 65 books and 300 articles. His accomplishments and awards are manifold. He is the founder of the Doctoral Program in African American Studies at Temple University and editor of *The Journal of Black Studies*. His latest books include *The History of Africa* and *An Afrocentric Manifesto*.



Clarence Sholé Johnson is Professor of Philosophy at Middle Tennessee State University. He is the author of *Cornel West and Philosophy: The Quest for Social Justice*, in addition to many articles in philosophy and African and African American studies. Professor Johnson is a native of Sierra Leone.
