### Here's Looking at You, Yid: Some Moments of Black Constructions of Jewishness

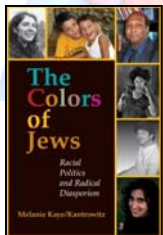
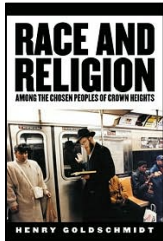
### Jews of Color: Undoing the Black/Jewish Binary
