Beth C. Koob is Chief Counsel for Health Services for Temple University and Temple University Health System. Ms. Koob also serves as the Corporate Secretary for Temple University Health System. In this position, she oversees all health care related legal matters for the University as well as all legal and governance matters for the Health System and its affiliated corporations.

In addition to her law degree, Ms. Koob holds an undergraduate degree in nursing with a minor in developmental psychology.

Ms. Koob has been an Adjunct Professor at Temple's College of Allied Health Professions, where she taught in the Health Information Management program, and at Temple University School of Law, where she taught Issues in Law and Medicine. In addition, she has frequently lectured and written on issues pertaining to patient safety and confidentiality, medical malpractice, healthcare ethics and healthcare regulatory matters. In 2004, Ms. Koob received the Woman of Achievement in Healthcare award from the March of Dimes. In 2006, Ms. Koob served on the Mcare Commission Advisory Task Force, a state-wide panel tasked with advising the state commission on phase-out plans for the Commonwealth's statutorily mandated excess professional liability coverage.
