

## **Ronda B. Goldfein, Esq.**

**Ronda B. Goldfein, Esq.**, is executive director of the AIDS Law Project of Pennsylvania, the nation's only independent public-interest law firm dedicated solely to helping people with HIV/AIDS. Since its founding in 1988, the Philadelphia-based firm has risen to the defense of almost 30,000 Pennsylvanians and won several landmark cases resulting in policy change to ensure that people with HIV/AIDS are treated with fairness and decency. A nationally recognized advocate for people living with HIV/AIDS, Goldfein is a frequent lecturer and a published author on legal issues facing people with HIV/AIDS. A graduate of the University of Miami, she holds a Juris Doctorate from the Shepard Broad Law Center of Nova Southeastern University in Fort Lauderdale, and is admitted to the Bars of Pennsylvania, New Jersey and New York. In 2005 she was voted a "Super Lawyer" in a poll of more than 36,000 Pennsylvania attorneys published jointly by *Law & Politics* and *Philadelphia Magazine*. In 2006, she was honored by Philadelphia FIGHT's Jonathan Lax Treatment Center for chairing FIGHT's Institutional Review Board, for which she received a citation from the Pennsylvania House of Representatives noting "her exemplary record of service, in keeping with the highest ideals of this Commonwealth." Goldfein is a vice president and member of the board of directors of the American Civil Liberties Union of Pennsylvania, and a member of the board of directors of the ACLU's Philadelphia chapter. In 2007, Goldfein was named "Policymaker of the Year" by the Penn Center for AIDS Research, a joint project of the University of Pennsylvania, the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and the Wistar Institute
