# Directions for obtaining an AccessNet Account

### HOW TO OBTAIN AN ACCESSNET ACCOUNT

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR HOSPITAL STAFF

1. Fill out a System Access Request Form (SARF) requesting Guest access to Temple University systems (access the form within the TUH network).
2. Once your request is approved, your information will be submitted into Banner (Temple's Human Resources database).
3. Within one hour of being submitted to Banner, a University TUid number will be generated (this is different than your Temple Hospital TUid number).
4. Within 24 hours of your TUid number being generated, your AccessNet account will be generated.
5. You will receive an automated e-mail directing you to go to <http://accounts.temple.edu> to activate your new AccessNet account.

  - ACP Journal Club


