**Temple’s new TUID –For your security!**

Temple University no longer uses social security numbers as the primary means of identification within the University. Instead, once a student has registered for the first time, Temple will issue a TUID number to help protect you and your personal information. You will use your TUID, rather than your Social Security number, to register, request academic information, drop and add classes, and perform other administrative functions within Temple. The Social Security number will still be requested for routine administrative functions as required by law, including tax purposes and the first time a student registers at Temple.

Here are some important points about the new TUID system:

**Fort Washington students:**

If you are a new student, the QA/RA Office will issue your new TUID when you register for your first class. You may then pick up a Temple ID card with your TUID number at the Fort Washington campus (401 Building) during regular office hours (generally 8:30 to 7:30 Mondays through Thursdays and 8:30 to 4:30 on Fridays. Call 267.468.8500 to confirm when that office is open and making Temple ID cards, particularly during summer and University “breaks” (winter and spring recess).

The Fort Washington campus does not require the use of TU ID cards for entry into classes; however, you will need a Temple ID, if you wish to use the campus library, recreational facilities, or computer labs.

Weekend students may have their ID cards created on specific dates and hours. Again, call 267.468.8500 to verify exact times and days.

**Remote students:**

Remote students do not need Temple ID cards and can only obtain them if they are willing to come to a Temple campus to have their photograph taken. Temple ID cards are primarily used for entrance into University buildings, computer labs, libraries, parking facilities, and other University-related functions.

If you are a remote student, we will e-mail or call you with your new TUID number. If you are a continuing student, you must have this new ID number to register for the fall semester, so please feel free to call us for your new TUID number.
