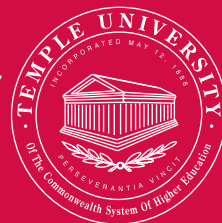

ANN WEAVER HART, the first female president of Temple, was elected the ninth president of the university on May 4, 2006 and assumed the office on July 1, 2006.

Hart previously was president of the University of New Hampshire, joining UNH in July 2002 from Claremont Graduate University in Claremont, Calif., where she was provost and vice president for academic affairs. Hart also served as professor of educational leadership, dean of the graduate school and special assistant to the president at the University of Utah.

Hart received bachelor's and master's degrees in history and a Ph.D. in educational administration, all from the University of Utah. Her research interests include leadership succession and development, work redesign and organizational behavior in educational organizations, and academic freedom and freedom of speech in higher education.

She has been recognized for her achievements and service by many organizations, including the Business and Professional Women's Foundation, the University Council for Educational Administration, and the Utah Women's Forum, and has been honored as a Distinguished Alumna of the College of Humanities of the University of Utah.

Hart and her husband, Randy, have four daughters and six grandchildren.

## TEMPLE UNIVERSITY



TEMPLE UNIVERSITY is a comprehensive public research university that enrolls more than 35,000 students. It is the 27th largest university in America and is among the nation's largest providers of professional education.

Founded in 1884 by Dr. Russell Conwell as an informal adult-education outgrowth of his Baptist Temple ministry, Temple College was chartered in 1888 and incorporated as Temple University in 1907. In 1965, Temple became a member of the Commonwealth System of Higher Education.

Temple University offers almost 300 programs, including associate, bachelor's, master's, doctoral and professional degrees.

The university maintains eight campuses in Pennsylvania. Its Main Campus and its Health Sciences Center, both in Philadelphia, are the primary sites of more than \$500 million in ongoing construction and renovation.

Around the world, Temple has campuses in Rome and Japan, and the university operates prestigious foreign study programs in China, Israel, Greece, Great Britain, France and elsewhere. Temple's Beasley School of Law initiated the first and only foreign law degree-granting program in China's history.

Temple has a distinguished faculty in 17 schools and colleges: the Fox School of Business and Management, the School of Communications and Theater, the College of Education, the College of Engineering, the Beasley School of Law, the College of Liberal Arts, the Boyer College of Music and Dance, the College of Science and Technology, the School of Social Administration and the School of Tourism and Hospitality Management at the Main Campus; the College of Health Professions, the Kornberg School of Dentistry, the School of Medicine and the School of Pharmacy at the Health Sciences Center; the School of Podiatric Medicine; the Tyler School of Art; and Ambler College.

The schools and colleges of the Health Sciences Center enjoy a close educational and working relationship with the Temple University Health System, anchored by Temple University Hospital, Temple University Children's Medical Center and Shriners Hospital for Children. Temple is widely recognized for providing exceptional primary care to an underserved community as well as for tertiary and quaternary care services that draw patients, faculty, and students from near and far.

Temple is a Carnegie Research-Intensive institution. Its interdisciplinary research draws on faculty expertise representing a wide range of disciplines, from medicine to engineering, and from the behavioral to the physical sciences. More than 100 faculty members each have at least \$1 million in external research funding.

Temple University employs nearly 6,000 people full time, about 1,700 of whom are faculty. Temple is governed by a 36-member Board of Trustees, one third of whom are appointed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Its ninth President is Ann Weaver Hart.

## THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The academic procession is a relic of medievalism in modern university life. The somber gowns and colorful hoods are similar to those worn by scholars and church men as early as the 12th century. The garb in those times had an element of utility; the robes were warm, and the hoods could be drawn up to protect against drafts in unheated buildings.

Gowns representing the bachelor's, master's and doctor's degrees vary in style. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves; the master's gown, longer and narrow closed sleeves that extend below the knees. The doctor's gown has full, bell-shaped sleeves with three bars of velvet and a front opening faced with wide velvet bands in either black or the color indicating the area of study.

## THE MACE

The Temple University mace was created by Stanley Lechtzin, professor of design at the Tyler School of Art for 45 years. Commissioned in 1964 by then President Millard Gladfelter, the mace was one of Lechtzin's first major commissions. It is used in every commencement, and has traveled to Rome for the 35th anniversary celebration of the Temple University Rome campus.

The mace is 40 inches high by 6.5 inches in diameter, and is made of sterling silver, enamel and cherry wood, with an accompanying cherry wood stand. The top has a stylized "T" with an enameled Temple University seal. The mace is a gift from the class of 1966.

## THE MEDALLION

The chain of office and medallion designed for President Ann Weaver Hart embody many of the qualities that designers Stanley Lechtzin and his collaborator Daniella Kerner have always professed as educators and artists. Lechtzin's exploration into the new digital medium is realized in this ceremonial object, created through computer-aided-design (CAD) and laser 3D printing.

Made of a white glass and polyamide alloy, the chain measures 36 inches over all. It symbolizes the collegial nature of the university, which is made of many integral, connected units. The Temple "T" is a graphic image used in the medallion.

## UNIVERSITY PRESIDENTS

### **Russell H. Conwell**

Founder of Temple College and pastor of Grace Baptist (Temple) Church. The temporary Board of Trustees elected him president of the faculty on October 14, 1887, and he served until his death on December 6, 1925.

### **Charles Ezra Beury**

Bank executive, lawyer and trustee of the university, he served as president from 1926 until 1941.

### **Robert Livingston Johnson**

Management consultant and former vice president of Time, Inc., he served as president from 1941 until 1959.

### **Millard E. Gladfelter**

Vice president and provost of the university before assuming office, he served as president from 1959 until 1967.

### **Paul R. Anderson**

Vice president of academic affairs of the university and a former president of Chatham College, he served from 1967 until 1973.

### **Marvin Wachman**

Vice president for academic affairs of the university and a former president of Lincoln University. Currently president emeritus of Temple University, he served from 1973 until 1982.

### **Peter J. Liacouras**

Former dean of Temple University School of Law and currently chancellor of Temple University, he served as president from 1982 until 2000.

### **David Adamany**

Former president of Wayne State University (1982-1997) and vice president for academic affairs at the University of Maryland. Currently chancellor of Temple University, he served as president from 2000 until 2006.
