RESEARCH IN PROGRESS

Child Health and Behavior Study (Dec. 2003-present): This project examines how factors specific to the child (e.g., temperament, cognitive abilities) interact with aspects of the child's many contexts (e.g., family, peers, neighborhood) to influence emotional and social adjustment, including the development of conduct problems and depressive symptoms, among inner-city families living in Philadelphia. The families involved in this study are assessed annually. In addition to their initial assessments, families have participated in one- and two-year follow-up assessments to date.

Children's Play and Friendship Project (August 2006-present): This study examines peer-child processes that occur on the playground (e.g., aggression, victimization) as predictors of conduct problems and depressive symptoms among inner-city children. This project builds on the Child Health and Behavior Study and considers child-specific processes (e.g., attention, emotion regulation) as potential moderators of these observed peer-child processes.

Child Health and Behavior Study Phase II (August 2007-present): This NIMH-funded project focuses on the roles of prefrontal, limbic, and peer-child interactional processes as predictors of conduct problems and depressive symptoms among inner-city children. Findings will provide the framework for a longitudinal study to examine what aspects of peer-child interactional and prefrontal processes place children at risk for conduct problems and depression, as well as what aspects of these factors may serve a protective function and contribute to positive development among contextually disadvantaged children.

Co-occurring Conduct Problems and Depressive Symptoms (March 2007-present): This NIMH-funded project uses three large, prospective datasets to examine the roles of peer-child interactional and prefrontal processes in the development of co-occurring conduct problems and depression. Several explanations for the development of co-occurring conduct problems and depressive symptoms will be examined concurrently using person- and variable-centered analyses. Each dataset considers different developmental periods and strategies for assessing symptoms and predictors of interest. Using multiple datasets will allow me to use multiple levels of analysis and a developmental psychopathology framework for examining this comorbidity.
