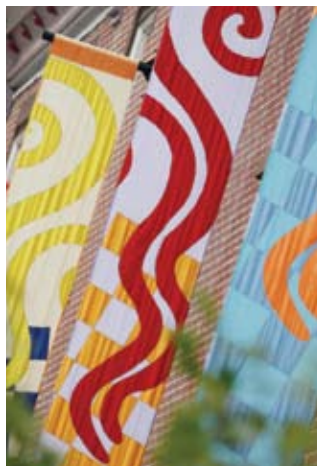

I am not enrolled in a degree program at Temple, but want to take a few courses. What should I do?

Students From Other Institutions

Temple University welcomes students from other institutions. You should complete the entire registration form, including the Visiting Student Authorization section which must be completed by a representative of your home institution. If your chosen courses have prerequisites, you must submit a transcript that indicates you have taken and passed the prerequisite courses. The registration form, and transcript if needed, should be faxed or mailed to the Temple campus you plan to attend.

Non-Matriculated (Non-Degree) Students

UNDERGRADUATE LEVEL: Students not currently enrolled at another institution may register at Temple as non-matriculated students. To enroll in undergraduate courses, you must have earned a high school diploma or GED certificate. If you have attended another college or university, you must have earned at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average and provide a transcript of your previous academic work. Non-matriculated students are generally required to take the university placement test before they register. For more information, contact any Temple registration office.

GRADUATE LEVEL: Non-matriculated graduate students can take up to three courses before admission to a degree program. At registration, you must provide proof of graduation from an accredited baccalaureate program. Some Temple graduate programs also require written faculty permission for enrollment.

Non-matriculated graduate students are encouraged to contact their chosen program at Temple for academic advising. Billing

All Temple University billing and registration information is communicated electronically, through students' Temple e-mail addresses. You are responsible for monitoring your e-mail for this information. Matriculated students receive an e-mail notification that their bill is available in TUpay. The due date for the bill is approximately 10 business days from the date the bill was issued.

Non-matriculated students receive Temple login and e-mail addresses by regular mail within a few days of registration. After that, you will receive an e-mail notification that the bill is available in TUpay. The due date for the bill is approximately 10 business days from the date the bill was issued.

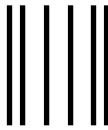

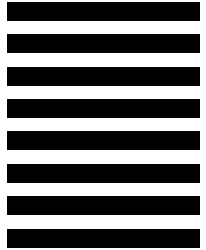
