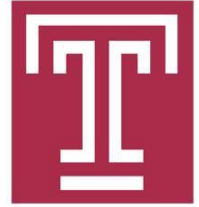


Research on Street-Based Sex Work and Other Vulnerable Populations

Location: Tech Center Room 111

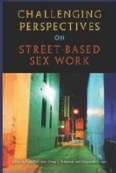


The Department of Criminal Justice and the School of Social Work are co-sponsoring a roundtable about research on street-based sex work and with populations who themselves are generally excluded from weighing in on areas that impact them. The discussion will focus on the connection between research and policymaking and its potential for both benefit and harm, the appropriate role for researchers, students, and academics, and how to meaningfully include in research the voices of those impacted by policies and programs targeting sex workers. This discussion is relevant to research with other vulnerable populations and we will also discuss intersectionality as an important feature of research about street-based sex work.
