

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE 2011-2012 ACADEMIC YEAR

Students accepted to the Tyler School of Art undergraduate programs who plan to enroll as full-time matriculants may compete for tuition scholarships offered through Tyler and Temple University. These include portfolio scholarships, academic scholarships, sports scholarships, band scholarships and leadership scholarships. Scholarships, grants, work-study, and loans may all be a part of a student's financial aid package. Check out www.temple.edu/sfs for more information. You should also be researching scholarship opportunities through sourcebooks and guides in your guidance office, as well as by surfing the Internet. All scholarship awards are subject to each financial year's funding process. Scholarships are available to Tyler students entering as full-time matriculated students in the fall semester only.

TEMPLE UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

Temple University offers incoming and continuing undergraduate students numerous scholarship opportunities to assist you in financing your education. These scholarships may be merit-based, need-based or a combination of the two. In most cases, students must be enrolled full-time and seeking a degree in order to qualify for these scholarships. TYLER PORTFOLIO-BASED MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

PORTFOLIO SCHOLARSHIPS (All Tyler undergraduate applicants)

Up to twenty merit-based scholarships ranging from \$1000 one-time awards to full tuition for four years. Awards are competitive, and based on merit as evidenced in the scholarship portfolio submitted as well as in the creativity and originality of the self-portrait. Architecture and Art History applicants are invited to compete and must submit a portfolio and self-portrait.

EDNA WEINSTEIN SCHOLARSHIPS (BFA Applicants Only)

Five \$2000 scholarships based on portfolio and financial need. The scholarship will be continued for 4 years, based on full-time matriculated status in the BFA program, continued evidence of financial need, available funds and a 3.0 cumulative GPA, for a maximum total award of \$8000. FAFSA required.

GILROY ROBERTS SCHOLARSHIPS (BFA Applicants Only- in memory of Gilroy Roberts, Chief Engraver & Sculptor of the United States Mint)

Two \$1000 tuition scholarships based on portfolio awarded to two BFA freshmen from Lower Merion Township in Montgomery County, PA. If no deserving applicant(s) is found from Lower Merion, the scholarship may be awarded to deserving freshmen from any other township in either Montgomery or Delaware Counties in PA. The scholarship will be continued for 4 years, based on full-time matriculated status in the BFA program, and a 3.0 cumulative GPA for a total award of \$4000.

NOTIFICATION OF SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Notification for finalist status in the portfolio scholarships will come in late March/early April. Some scholarships require that financial aid forms be filed - please read each scholarship description carefully for requirements.

SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINES

PLEASE NOTE: Due to the quantity of applications, there are no extensions to the deadlines and no exceptions can be made.

Applicants for portfolio scholarships must ensure that the original self portraits are delivered to and received by the Tyler Admissions Office on or before March 1. Portfolio scholarships are not transferable into any other Temple degree program outside of Tyler School of Art. Portfolio based scholarships will be awarded to full-time matriculants entering into the Fall semester only. The deadlines listed below are portfolio scholarship consideration only. The deadlines for admission into the Tyler programs are posted by Temple University. Please check the Temple Admissions website for updated application deadline information at www.temple.edu/undergrad. **Important:** Tyler has gone to a waitlist long before the deadlines, so be sure to apply early!

February 1

BFA, BA in Visual Studies, and BS in Art Education freshman applicants: Deadline to pass a portfolio review if competing for portfolio scholarship. If uploading a portfolio at www.temple.slideroom.com in lieu of an in-person portfolio review, the images must be uploaded to www.temple.slideroom.com * by this date. The first 10 images will be considered as the scholarship portfolio submission.. Please note that on-campus reviews are available on a first-come, first-served basis, and appointments should be made at least a month in advance.

March 1

All Scholarship Applicants (transfer and freshmen): Deadline for receipt of 10 images for scholarship consideration uploaded to www.temple.slideroom.com.* All application materials (including Temple application, standardized scores, transcripts, self-portrait, statement of purpose (BFA), writing exercise (BA in Visual Studies or BS in Art Education), scholarship portfolio and all other necessary application materials) must be received in the appropriate offices by this date. **Please note:** It can take up to 3-4 weeks for Temple to post transcripts to the online application. Be sure to check OwlNet for your application status.

Transfer applicants to the BFA, BA in Visual Studies, and BS in Art Education programs (applicants to Architecture and Art History may also elect to submit a portfolio and self portrait for scholarship consideration): Deadline for receipt of a portfolio uploaded to www.temple.slideroom.com *. The first 10 images in your digital portfolio will be used for consideration for scholarship. All application materials must be received in the appropriate offices by this date.
