**Notes:** The B.A. in Psychology major at Temple University consists of 44 credits, including 40 credits in Psychology and 4 credits in a designated science area. Per the CLA Residency Requirement, students must complete at least half of major credits at Temple.

- 1) Students who transfer to Temple with an A.S. in Psychology have satisfied the terms of the Temple-DCCC GenEd-to-GenEd transfer agreement and have completed the General Education requirements necessary to graduate from Temple University.
- 2) Students should take BIOL 121: General Biology at MCCC as this course transfers to Temple as BIOL 1012: General Biology II and counts towards the Psychology major science requirement. BIOL 120 (Temple equivalent BIOL 1007) will NOT count for this requirement.
- 3) MAT 130: Probability and Statistics will transfer as STAT 2103: Statistical Business Analytics and will satisfy the PSY 1003: Statistics for Psychology, a requirement for the Psychology major at Temple, via DARS exception
- 4) The College of Liberal Arts at Temple University requires all students to demonstrate second-level proficiency in a foreign language. A 101 level foreign language course at MCCC may partially fulfill this requirement. A 102 level foreign language course at MCCC may satisfy this requirement.

**Notes:** Students following this plan are under the GenEd-to-GenEd General Education program.

- a) To earn a CLA baccalaureate degree, a student must complete a minimum of 123 credits, including: 90 credits in CLA/CST courses, 45 credits of which must be at the upper level (numbered 2000-4999). Of that, 6 credits must be outside the student's major division (e.g. Social Sciences or Humanities) (See transfer policies c & d below for more information)
- b) The College of Liberal Arts at Temple University requires all students to demonstrate second-level proficiency in a foreign language.
- c) Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete [45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program](#) as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated student previously took Temple courses on a non-matriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.
- d) Per Temple's Transfer Policy for [Permission to Complete a Course at Another Institution after Matriculation](#), students who transfer 60 credits or more cannot receive permissions to transfer additional course work
