Notes:

1. Course satisfies a major requirement at Temple.
2. MAT 130 and MAT 131 can be used in place of MAT 135 and MAT 136 to fulfill the Fox requirement for Calculus and also fulfills the Quantitative Literacy requirement (GQ) at Temple. Students interested in Actuarial Science should contact the Office of Enrollment Management in the Fox School for suggested mathematics courses for Actuarial Science.
3. Students are recommended to take courses in the Fox School's Business Core as their Business Electives. DCCC courses that fulfill Fox School core requirements are BUS210, BUS230, and INS100. Students selecting other courses may need additional semesters to complete the degree.
4. Students are recommended to take the 1 credit lab course, BUS 221 as a supplement to BUS 220. Fox will accept the combination of DCCC's BUS 220 and 221 as fulfilling the Statistics 2103 requirement. Students transferring BUS 220 without the additional 1 credit lab course will need to complete Statistics 2103 at Temple.
5. Students who complete the A.S. in Business Administration at DCCC are included in the DCCC-Temple Core-to-Core Transfer Agreement, and therefore, have satisfied all of the GenEd requirements at Temple.

Graduation Requirements

Associate in Science in Business Administration at Delaware County Community College to Bachelor of Business Administration degree at Temple (Fall 2010 and later)

The degree of Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) may be conferred upon a student by recommendation of the faculty and upon the satisfactory completion of a minimum of 124 semester hours of credit with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 overall and in the major. A minimum of 124 credit hours will be earned in the following four requirement categories plus free electives if needed:

University General Education – Requirement fulfilled when student completes the Associate in Science in Business Administration degree at DCCC.

Fox School of Business and Management Requirements

Lower Division Foundation Requirements – Many of these requirements are completed when students follow the Fox School of Business and Delaware County Community College Program-to-Program agreement. For best transferability, students should take classes listed below to fill electives at DCCC. Any courses that are taken at DCCC that are not listed below may transfer as free electives.
