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General Information

ADMISSION

Applying to graduate school is a multi-faceted process that warrants careful consideration and preparation. Determining admission to a Temple University graduate program involves more than the numerical total of standardized test scores and grade point averages. Each program's graduate faculty members e valuate admissibility based on your comprehensive package of admissions materials. Although tests and grades are important, research interests, past employment, portfolios, and the statement of goals are also essential in the process of deciding admission for the limited spaces available in many of our programs.

Therefore, to present the most comprehensive admissions package, you need to think about each component of the process. For instance, you need to consider judiciously who can provide recommendations that demonstrate thoughtful insight into your abilities; to prepare carefully your statement of goals with emphasis on your individual strengths, interests, and future endeavors; and to choose attentively a portfolio or writing sample that accurately represents your abilities and talents. Although these are just a few steps in the application process, each stage is a building block for your graduate career.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Each graduate department has unique deadlines for the submission of completed applications. Please refer to pages 6-8 to learn which deadline applies to your program. Your application and all other supporting credentials must be sent to the appropriate Temple office by the deadline date.

Please be aware that while every program may have a stated application deadline, many admit qualified applicants on a rolling basis so long as spaces are available. Since available spaces are often filled earlier than the deadline date, applicants are urged to apply as early as possible. For more information on space availability contact the department or program.

APPLICATION FEE

A non-refundable fee in the amount of \$40* must accompany your application. A check or money order should be made payable to Temple University. Please do not send cash. Do not send a check or money order in excess of the required amount. The application fee is nonrefundable and cannot be credited toward any charges if you subsequently register as a student.

MATRICULATION FEE

At the time of your acceptance into a graduate program at Temple, a non-refundable fee of \$10.00 will be required to reserve your admission. In addition, some departments may require a tuition deposit.

MATERIALS TO SEND

All programs require a completed Application Form and one certified copy of official academic records from every college and university attended,including Temple University. In addition,most programs require some or all of the following:

- a recognized test of scholastic aptitude,e.g., Graduate Record Examination (General and/or Subject),the Miller Analogies Test,the Graduate Management AdmissionsTest;
- letters of reference;
- an interview;
- an audition (e.g., dance, theater, music);
- exhibits or a portfolio to demonstrate creative potential and ability (in fields such as art, film and media arts, music composition, etc.);
- a separate financial aid application for students seeking aid.

Test scores must be sent by the testing service directly to Temple University. See page 5, "Standardized Examinations."

The applicant is responsible for ensuring that all necessary materials are received by the stated application date.

All application materials, except portfolios and exhibits, become the property of Temple University and will not be copied, returned, or forwarded to another institution.

Portfolios and exhibits should be sent directly to the department or program requesting them;correspondence concerning the form and shipment of these materials should be directed to the department or program.

ELIGIBILITY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Graduate students are eligible for various kinds of financial assistance from private, university, state, and federal sources. To qualify for most types of financial aid, students must first be admitted to a graduate program, and, in the case of university awards, students must be attending full time. Since faculty nominate or designate candidates for university support, students should consult with their advisers or department chairpersons about application procedures.

Financial support awards, including Fellowships and Assistantships, are evaluated beginning February 1st. Therefore, to be considered for competition, students are urged to have all application materials submitted to the department to which they are applying by late December. Some departments may begin the evaluation process earlier; check pages 6-8 for specific dates.

If calculated need is sufficient to qualify for a subsidized loan, the federal government will pay an interest subsidy during the period of enrollment and six (6) months after completing or terminating studies. Graduate students must be enrolled for a minimum of five (5) credit hours in a degree program to borrow up to an annual amount of \$8,500. Unsubsidized Stafford loans are available to students who have their calculated need met. Graduate students may borrow up to an annual maximum amount of \$10,000 and are required to pay the interest subsidy during enrollment and the grace period.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY

Eligibility for Federal Work Study (FWS) is based on student need determined from the information on the student's FAFSA. Furthermore, students must be enrolled at least half time and maintain satisfactory academic progress.

Students are paid weekly for hours worked.

OTHER SOURCES OF FUNDING
