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General Information

ADMISSION

Applying to graduate school is a multi-faceted process that warrants careful consideration and preparation. Determining admission to a Temple University graduate program involves more than the numerical total of standardized test scores and grade point averages. Each program's graduate faculty members evaluate admissibility based on your comprehensive package of admissions materials. Although tests and grades are important, research interests, past employment, portfolios, and the statement of goals are also essential in the process of deciding admission for the limited spaces available in many of our programs.

Therefore, to present the most comprehensive admissions package, you need to think about each component of the process. For instance, you need to consider judiciously who can provide recommendations that demonstrate thoughtful insight into your abilities; to prepare carefully your statement of goals with emphasis on your individual strengths, interests, and future endeavors; and to choose attentively a portfolio or writing sample that accurately represents your abilities and talents. Although these are just a few steps in the application process, each stage is a building block for your graduate career.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Each graduate department has unique deadlines for the submission of completed applications. Please refer to pages 6-8 to learn which deadline applies to your program. Your application and all other supporting credentials must be sent to the appropriate Temple office by the deadline date.

Please be aware that while every program may have a stated application deadline, many admit qualified applicants on a rolling basis so long as spaces are available. Since available spaces are often filled earlier than the deadline date, applicants are urged to apply as early as possible. For more information on space availability contact the department or program.

APPLICATION FEE

A non-refundable fee in the amount of \$40* must accompany your application. A check or money order should be made payable to Temple University. Please do not send cash. Do not send a check or money order in excess of the required amount. The application fee is non-refundable and cannot be credited toward any charges if you subsequently register as a student.

*All tuition and fees are subject to change by action of The Board of Trustees.

MATRICULATION FEE

At the time of your acceptance into a graduate program at Temple, a non-refundable fee of \$10.00 will be required to reserve your admission. In addition, some departments may require a tuition deposit.

MATERIALS TO SEND

All programs require a completed Application Form and one certified copy of official academic records from every college and university attended, including Temple University. In addition, most programs require some or all of the following:

- a recognized test of scholastic aptitude, e.g., Graduate Record Examination (General and/or Subject), the Miller Analogies Test, the Graduate Management Admissions Test;
- letters of reference;
- an interview:
- an audition (e.g.,dance,theater, music);
- exhibits or a portfolio to demonstrate creative potential and ability (in fields such as art, film and media arts, music composition, etc.);
- a separate financial aid application for students seeking aid.

Please consult the department or program in which you are interested.

Test scores must be sent by the testing service directly to Temple University. See page 5, "Standardized Examinations."

The applicant is responsible for ensuring that all necessary materials are received by the stated application date.

All application materials, except portfolios and exhibits, become the property of Temple University and will not be copied, returned, or forwarded to another institution.

Portfolios and exhibits should be sent directly to the department or program requesting them; correspondence concerning the form and shipment of these materials should be directed to the department or program.

WHERE TO SEND YOUR APPLICATION

Your graduate application and all corresponding materials should be sent directly to the department or program to which you are applying. See page 15 for specific addresses.

- 2.Send the form to each individual who will provide a reference.

Temple University reserves the right to verify and acknowledge with a referee all reference reports.

ACADEMIC RECORDS

You must submit to Temple one certified copy of your official academic records (transcripts) from every college and university you have attended,including Temple University. Academic records must be submitted for all graduate and undergraduate work,whether you received a degree from that institution or not. If you attended more than one undergraduate and/or graduate institution, photocopy the academic records request form and send copies to all schools attended. Each academic records form is two-sided.

Follow these instructions:

- 1.Complete the front side of the academic request form found in this application.
- 2.Send the form to the Registrar at each college and university you have attended.

(Most universities charge a fee for this service. In order to avoid a delay in processing, be sure to submit payment with your request for the copy of your academic records to each college/university.)

Requirements For International Students

APPLICATION FEE

A non-refundable \$40 application fee is required of all students. Payment by check must be in U.S.dollars,drawn on a U.S.bank or on a U.S.branch of a foreign bank. A postal money order in U.S.dollars is also acceptable.

INTERNATIONAL APPLICATION DEADLINES

Unless the department to which you are applying has an earlier deadline, applications must be complete and submitted to your intended department no later than the following dates:

January admission — September 1 September admission — January 15 Summer admission — January 15

TEST OF ENGLISH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE (TOEFL)

This test is required of all applicants who are not native speakers of English, regardless of previous language of instruction. Applicants having an undergraduate degree conferred by an American university are exempted from the TOEFL requirement. However, applicants having a graduate degree conferred by an American university are NOT exempted from the TOEFL requirement.

To be admitted to graduate study, a student must score a minimum of either 575 on the paper and pencil version or 230 on the computer-based version (CBT) of the TOEFL. Students admitted with TOEFL scores below either 600 on the paper and pencil or 250 on the CBT will be required to take an English skills course during their first semester at Temple University.

The TOEFL examination is an ADDITIONAL requirement for international applicants. It is not a substitute for the standardized examinations (GRE,GMAT, MAT) that may be required for admission.

OFFICIAL EDUCATIONAL DOCUMENTS

Applicants must have their official post-secondary transcripts forwarded by their post-secondary institution to the department to which they are applying. Applicants must request all transcripts from all post-secondary institutions, regardless of the amount of work/courses completed (i.e.,transcript must be forwarded even if only one course was taken). Failure to receive a post-secondary transcript means that the application is incomplete. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed. Temple University reserves the right to authenticate academic records,test scores,and letters of reference as it sees fit.

Unsealed post-secondary school transcripts in the student's possession are neither official nor acceptable for admissions purposes. Applicants who have completed a post-secondary program must also submit a photocopy of their degree or certificate.

Translations must be submitted for all documents that are written in a language other than English. Official copies of the original language documents must be submitted with the translations. For those applicants residing in the U.S.,an acceptable translation would be one done by the following:the consulate or embassy of the document's issuing country or an acceptable professional translation service. For those applicants living in their own country, an acceptable translation would be one completed by the institution that issued the document.

- All translations must be prepared using the same format as the original document.
- All information must be translated.
- The translation must be verbatim.
- No interpretation or evaluation of information should be included (e.g.,if a grade of 85 appears on the Chinese language version,then an 85,not an "A," should appear on the translation).
- The translation must be typed, and it must be signed by the translator.
- Each applicant is responsible for any altered documents submitted. If an altered document is submitted, the applicant will be rejected, and Temple University may notify the issuing board or institution.

ELIGIBILITY FOR FINANCIAL AID

Graduate students are eligible for various kinds of financial assistance from private, university, state, and federal sources. To qualify for most types of financial aid, students must first be admitted to a graduate program, and, in the case of university awards, students must be attending full time. Since faculty nominate or designate candidates for university support, students should consult with their advisers or department chairpersons about application procedures.

Financial support awards, including Fellowships and Assistantships, are evaluated beginning February 1st. Therefore, to be considered for competition, students are urged to have all application materials submitted to the department to which they are applying by late December. Some departments may begin the evaluation process earlier; check pages 6-8 for specific dates.

LOAN PROGRAMS

FEDERAL STAFFORD LOANS

Federal Stafford Loans are based on calculated need determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Stafford Loans are available at local banks, credit unions,and other lending institutions. If calculated need is sufficient to qualify for a subsidized loan,the federal government will pay an interest subsidy during the period of enrollment and six (6) months after completing or terminating studies. Graduate students must be enrolled for a minimum of five (5) credit hours in a degree program to borrow up to an annual amount of \$8,500. Unsubsidized Stafford loans are available to students who have their calculated need met. Graduate students may borrow up to an annual maximum amount of \$10,000 and are required to pay the interest subsidy during enrollment and the grace period.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY

Eligibility for Federal Work Study (FWS) is based on student need determined from the information on the student's FAFSA. Furthermore, students must be enrolled at least half time and maintain satisfactory academic progress.

Students are paid weekly for hours worked.

OTHER SOURCES OF FUNDING

Temple's Department of Student Financial Services maintains a small library of financial aid source books. Similar materials are available in local libraries. Several funding search sites are also available on the world wide web (i.e., FASTWEB).


