ACADEMICS



<u>Osimiri Sprowal</u>, a 2020 graduate of the <u>College of Liberal Arts</u>, has been awarded a <u>Marshall Scholarship</u> to study for a graduate degree in the United Kingdom. Sprowal is just the 5th Temple student to receive this award.
